## DISTRICT

St. Tammany Parish (county) has ranked as one of the fastest growing counties in the United States during the past decade. St. Tammany Parish Public School System serves over 35,500 students in 53 schools, all of which are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI). The St. Tammany Parish Public School System has earned the distinction of District-Wide accreditation.

St. Tammany Parish Public School System was named one of the top 100 school districts within the Nation's major metropolitan areas by **Money** magazine. St. Tammany Parish Public School System is the first and only School District in the State of Louisiana and one of only 42 school districts in the entire nation to receive the EPA's Energy Star-Leader Award for its leadership in improving its average energy performance rating and reducing greenhouse gas emissions through superior energy management.

**THE COMMUNITY:** Mandeville High School, one of eight public high schools in St. Tammany Parish, is located in Mandeville, Louisiana. Mandeville is a suburban community approximately thirty miles commuting distance to the metropolitan area of New Orleans, LA. Mandeville High has been recognized as a Blue Ribbon School of Excellence by the U.S. Department of Education.

**CHARACTERISTICS:** Mandeville High School is a co-ed, public high school enrolling approximately 1,700 students in grades 9-12. Approximately 93% of our graduates continue their education, 89% to four-year colleges or universities and 4% to two-year colleges and other post-secondary institutions. There are 389 students in the Senior Class of 2010.

**FACULTY:** There are 120 members on the professional staff. Of those 120, 58 have a Master's degree or higher.

Rank in class is calculated on a maximum of 28 credits, of which a maximum of 16 credits may be weighted. The student(s) who earns the most quality points will be ranked number one in the graduating class.
